SEEING THROUGH GOD'S EYES

Melissa Thiessen, 2023 SBC Grad, shares about experiencing God's presence during her overseas trip

Each year, SBC has a unique and adventurous opportunity for third-year students - visiting another country for a three week period to learn and experience culture and the church. This year, our class got to visit Central Asia! We visited many regions with new and challenging charms. We cherished every moment with those we met along the way as we have come to love not only the different areas, but its vibrant people who we now call friends. Our team of thirteen shared about these experiences on the SBC website, and I am here to share one of my own.

During our last week, the team split into three groups, each exploring new parts of the region. The team I was a part of spent a few days in the most beautiful farming town which grew olives and peaches in



abundance. This town has a rich history of art, specifically tile painting. As we walked the streets, seeing all the history and art shops, I felt the age of this people. There are homes and structures here which have been built upon the ruins of the Roman Empire and older ruins still. Generations have lived here without a thought of moving, and it is easy to see why.

One of the days we set out to pray as we walked. I strongly felt that instead of walking, I needed to sit and watch. So I left the group to have a delicious cup of Turkish coffee next to a school and within a small plaza of artisans. I took in the sounds and tried to pray, but no words came to me. I slowly finished my coffee and walked across the street to get a better view of the school.

Here I saw a large group of parents waiting to walk their children home from school. Across the school was a mosque and a small park. I sat here on a bench, in view of the school, the park, and the mosque. I watched as the children were let out, as a grandfather played with his young grandson, a group of boys chasing each other shouting "tavuk" (which means chicken), and I still had no sense of what to pray. My eyes were continually drawn to the simple existence of those around me. I looked upon their faces. I observed a moment of love and joy between the grandfather and child, the rush of the mothers, the frustration of the boy being called a chicken, and I felt like crying.

I felt God calling me to just look at his works of art. To take in the glory of what He has created, that which will not last for hundreds of years, that which man cannot replicate, and what no one stops to marvel over.



That morning we had set out to prayer walk through the town. My attitude was that I had something to give this place, that I needed to pray the presence of God over this place and be faithful. What God wanted of me was to slow down and see with His eyes. I imagine God sitting on that bench with me, watching as his creation played. I could not understand the language, and I most definitely stood out as a foreigner, but God felt right at home.

The barriers I saw of language, culture, gender, and status were all lost to God. He fully knows what his children need, and in

that moment what they needed was to be seen as more precious than our difference. There is something about the glory of a person that causes the details of their face to slip our mind. We are able to recognize the people we love from a distance and remember their faces. However, if we were asked to draw or perfectly describe our mothers from memory, most of us would have a very hard time doing so. It is as if God has created us in such a way that we cannot handle the depth of how Good we have been created. Looking into the eyes of a sister must be broken with a smile as the intensity grows because there is something so inherently beautiful about a face.

The image of God, a glimpse of Goodness, a being like no other, because they were made 'very good'. This is part of what prayer has taught me while on the MX3 trip. That sometimes God wants us to stop and really look at what is happening around us and praise Him for the goodness He has created. **Q**

ALUMNI UPDATE

SBC alumnus Trevor Elias shares where God has lead him since graduating from college.

Near the end of my time in high school I began sensing a call to pastoral ministry. Specifically to be a pastor in a small town that didn't yet have a strong Christian presence. Naturally, I decided I should go to Bible College to prepare myself for wherever God would lead in this.

I decided on Steinbach Bible College and made my way there after taking a gap year. While at SBC I studied the Bible together with classmates and knowledgeable professors. I also developed my skills and learned new ministry skills, all while enjoying life in a community of believers, many of which were there for similar reasons.

Some of the highlights I remember are the mission trips (specifically in the Philippines), building friendships, being mentored by professors, and being a CGL (Care Group Leader). I was challenged to think through things that I had previously just accepted or rejected without looking into why. After Bible College I got a number of job offers for different ministry positions. I ended up accepting a job at Pembina Valley Bible Camp where I served for over five years as the Program Director.

This was a great place to put the things I had learned to use through leading teams of staff and teaching God's Word. The camp community feel was even quite similar during certain seasons to the community I had experienced at SBC.

While at camp, I married my wife Renee and a while later we had our first son! Throughout the ten years from finishing up high school, completing Bible College and working at camp, God continued to affirm the call of pastoral ministry for my life.

Renee and I ended up applying with Village Missions – a ministry that seeks to place full-time pastors in small communities across North America – and got accepted into their program. We were then placed in Binscarth, MB to pastor the small church of Binscarth Christian Assembly. Binscarth is a community that's just off Highway 16, 10 minutes south of Russell and an hour north of Virden.

God has been so good to us! We are thankful for His work in our lives each day. I have only been in this role a couple of months, but I already love my job and seeing the ways that God is working in this community!



As I go about pastoring I frequently put to use both the skills and knowledge I gained while at SBC. Thanks SBC for doing your part in helping prepare me for the work God is doing in, and through, my life! **Q**
